## In Memoriam

... of Professor **Clotilde Paul, PhD.** (1931–2015). For many years I had the pleasure and the honor of working alongside her at the Sociedade Visconde de São Leopoldo, at the Catholic University of Santos, at various military events where she lectured on the patrons of the army, of weapons and support, and much more...

To give an example of only one of her countless academic activities, in 2014 I had the honor of representing her at the *8th International Workshop on Fortresses and Frontiers*, promoted by the Center for Studies on Military Architecture in Almeida, a historic Portuguese city where the Battle of the Côa River (1810) took place during the French invasions.

She was unable to attend, so it fell to me to represent her during the presentation of studies on the participation of **José Bonifácio de Andrada e Silva**, the patron of our independence, in that famous battle that "gained time" needed to prepare for the defense of Lisbon. José Bonifácio, a commissioned lieutenant colonel in the Portuguese army, commanded a battalion of teachers and students from the University of Coimbra. This subject was presented by Professor Clotilde, and was not well known among us in Brazil.
