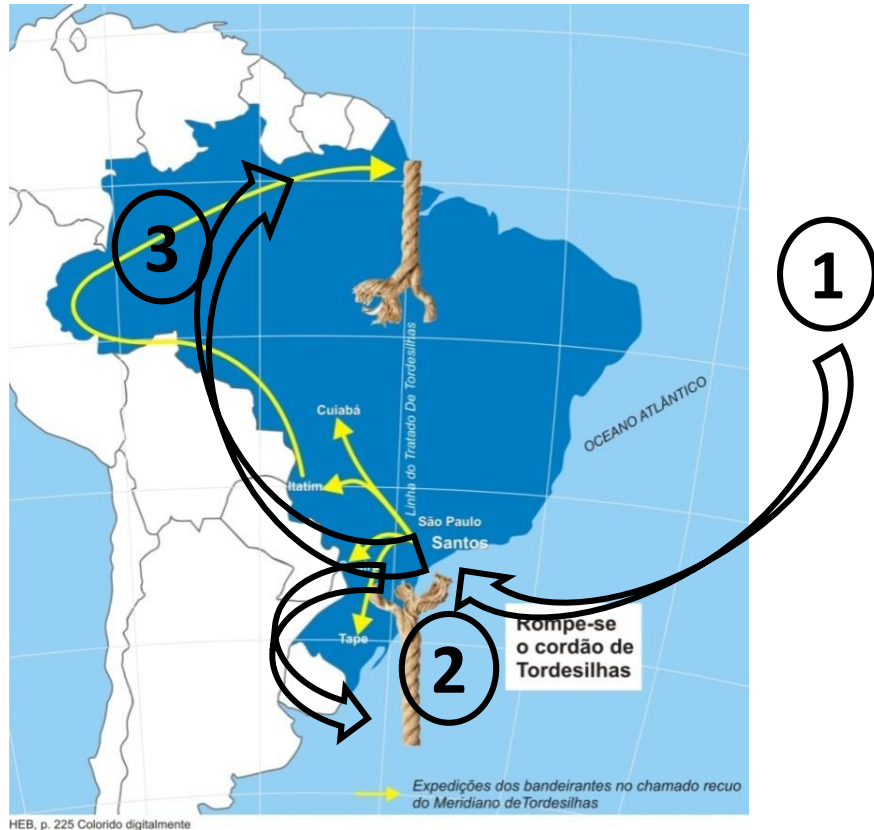


The conquest of new lands

The conquest of new lands obeyed an operational phasing that much resembles the Greek invasions of the Asian coast of the Aegean Sea during the Trojan War (c. 500 BC), or the allies on the European coast of the North Sea during the landing in Normandy (1944 AD), comprising:

- 1_ the projection of military power through “rough seas”,
- 2_ the establishment and consolidation of “beachheads” and, finally,
- 3_ the deepening of success toward the territory to be conquered.
